Ordinary Business:

1. To receive, consider and adopt the Standalone Audited Financial Statement of the Company for the year ended 31st March, 2020 including Audited Balance Sheet, Statement of Profit & Loss as at 31st March, 2020 together with Statement of Cash Flows and the Report of the Board of Directors and Auditors thereon.

2. To appoint a Director in place of **Mr. Dinesh Yadav (DIN-07843240)** Director of the Company, who retires by rotation and being eligible, offers himself for re-appointment.

Special Business:

3. Authority to Board of Directors to borrow money above the limit prescribed u/s 180(1) (c).

To consider and if, thought fit to pass with or without modifications, the following resolutions as a Special Resolution:

- As you are aware, in view of the situation arising due to COVID-19 global pandemic, the general meetings of the Companies can be conducted as per the guidelines issued by the Ministry of Corporate Affairs (MCA) vide Circular No. 14/2020 dated April 8, 2020, Circular No.17/2020 dated April 13, 2020 and Circular no 20/2020 dated May 05, 2020 and SEBI Circular number SEBI/HO/CFD/CMD1/CIR/P/2020/79 dated May 12, 2020. The forthcoming AGM will thus be held through video conferencing (VC) or other audio visual means (OAVM) and not through physical presence of members at a common venue. Hence, Members can attend and participate in the ensuing AGM through VC/ OAVM.
- Pursuant to the provisions of the Companies Act, 2013, a Member entitled to attend and vote at the Annual General Meeting is entitled to appoint a proxy to attend and vote on his/her behalf and the proxy need not be a Member of the Company. Since this AGM will be held pursuant to the said MCA Circulars through VC/OAVM, physical attendance of Members has been dispensed with. Accordingly, the facility for appointment of proxies by the Members will not be available for this Annual General Meeting and hence the Proxy Form and Attendance Slip are not annexed to the Notice.
- Institutional/Corporate Shareholders (i.e. other than individuals/HUF, NRI, etc) are required to send a scanned copy (PDF/JPEG Format) of its Board Resolution or governing body Resolution/Authorisation etc., authorising its representative to attend the Annual General Meeting through VC/OAVM on its behalf and to vote through remote e-voting. The said Resolution/Authorization shall be sent to the Scrutinizer by email through their registered email address to cs@manavinfra.com with copies marked to evoting@nsdl.co.in.
- Members who have not registered their E-mail address so far are requested to register their e-mail for receiving all communication including Annual Report, Notices and Circulars etc. from the company electronically. Members can do this by updating their email addresses with their depository participants.
- To support the ‘Green Initiative’, Members who have not yet registered their email addresses are requested to register the same with their DPs in case the shares are held by them in electronic form and with RTA in case the shares are held by them in physical form.
- Members holding shares in dematerialized form are requested to intimate all changes pertaining to their bank details such as bank account number, name of the bank and branch details, MICR Code and IFSC Code, mandates, nomination, power of attorney, change of address, change of name, email address, contact numbers, etc to their depository participant (“DP”). Members holding shares in physical form are requested to intimate such changes to Company's RTA, i.e. Karvy Fintech Private Limited along with relevant evidences or supporting.
- The Securities and Exchange Board of India (“SEBI”) has mandated the submission of Permanent Account Number (PAN) by every participant in Securities Market. Members holding shares in electronic form are therefore requested to submit PAN to their depository participants with whom they are maintaining their demat accounts. Members holding shares in physical form can submit their PAN details to Company's RTA i.e. Karvy Fintech Private Limited.
- SEBI has also made amendment to Regulation 40 of SEBI LODR Regulations with respect to mandatory dematerialization for transfer of securities. Pursuant to the aforesaid amendment to SEBI LODR Regulations, Listed Companies and their Registrars and Transfer Agents (“RTAs”) are advised to ensure that shares which are lodged for transfer are mandatory in dematerialized form with effect from April 1,

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2019. Therefore, shareholders are requested to get their physical shareholding dematerialized for any further transfers, if they wish so. However, they can continue to hold shares in physical mode.
9. The Register of Members and the Share Transfer Books of the Company will remain closed from Friday, 18th September, 2020 to Thursday, 24th September, 2020 (both days inclusive).
10. Pursuant to Section 72 of the Companies Act, 2013, shareholders holding shares in physical form may file their nomination in the prescribed Form SH-13 with the Company's Registrar and Share Transfer Agent. In respect of shares held in electric/demat form, the nomination form can be filed with the respective Depository Participants.
11. The Notice of the Annual General Meeting along with the Annual Report for the financial year 2019-20 is being sent only by electronic mode to those Members whose email addresses are registered with the Company/Depositories in accordance with the aforesaid MCA Circulars and circular issued by SEBI dated May 12, 2020. Members may note that the Notice of Annual General Meeting and Annual Report for the financial year 2019-20 will also be available on the Company's website; websites of the Stock Exchange. Members can attend and participate in the Annual General Meeting through VC/OAVM facility only.
12. Members attending the meeting through VC/OAVM shall be counted for the purposes of reckoning the quorum under Section 103 of the Companies Act, 2013.
13. Voting rights shall be reckoned on the paid-up value of shares registered in the name of member/beneficial owners (in case of electronic shareholding) as on the cut-off date i.e. Friday, 18th September, 2020.
14. In case of joint holders, the Member whose name appears as the first holder in the order of names as per the Register of Members of the Company will be entitled to vote at the AGM.

16. A. VOTING THROUGH ELECTRONIC MEANS

- i. Pursuant to provisions of Section 108 of the Companies Act, 2013 and Rule 20 of the Companies (Management and administration) Rules, 2014, as amended by the Companies (Management and Administration) Amendment Rules, 2015 and Regulation 44 of SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosures Requirements), 2015 ("Listing Regulations"), the Company is pleased to provide members, the facility to exercise their vote at the 29th Annual General Meeting (AGM) by electronic means and the business may be transacted through e-voting services. The facility of casting the votes by the members using an electronic voting system from a place other than venue of the AGM ("remote e-voting") will be provided NSDL.
- ii. The remote-e-voting period commences on Tuesday, 22nd September, 2020 (10.00 a.m. IST) and ends on Thursday, 24th September, 2020 (5.00 p.m. IST). During this period, Members of the Company holding shares either in physical form or in dematerialized form as on Friday, 18th September, 2020 (hereinafter called as "Cut-off Date"), may cast their vote electronically. The E-voting module shall be disabled by NSDL for voting thereafter. Those Members, who will be present in the AGM through VC / OAVM facility and have not cast their vote on the Resolutions through remote e-voting and are otherwise not barred from doing so, shall be eligible to vote through e-voting system during the AGM.

Any person who acquires shares of the Company and becomes a Member of the Company after sending of the Notice and holding shares as of the cut-off date, may obtain the login ID and password by sending a request at evoting@nsdl.co.in. Explanatory Statement Pursuant To Section 102 of the Companies Act, 2013 (The Act)

Item No.3:

To approve powers of the Board under the provisions of Section 180(1)(c) of the Companies Act, 2013, the Board of Directors of a Company can, with the consent of the Members obtained by Special Resolution, borrow moneys, apart from temporary loans obtained from the Company's Bankers in the ordinary course of business, in excess of the aggregate of the paid-up capital and free reserves of the Company, that is to say, reserves not



set apart for any specific purpose.

Keeping in view of the Company's business requirements and growth plans, it is considered appropriate to increase the aforesaid limit of borrowing. Your consent is therefore sought to authorize the Board to borrow up to 20 crores.

The Board of Directors recommends the Special Resolution set out in Item No. 3 of the accompanying Notice for the approval of the Members of the Company.

Item 4:

Members of the Company are further to note that section 180(1)(a) of the Companies Act, 2013 mandates that the Board of Directors of the Company shall exercise the power to sell, lease or otherwise dispose of the whole or substantially the whole of any undertaking(s) of the Company, only with the approval of the members of the Company by way of special resolution.

Explanation (i) to section 180(1)(a) of the Companies Act, 2013 states that the meaning of an "undertaking" shall mean an undertaking in which the investment of the Company exceeds twenty per cent of its net worth as per the audited balance sheet of the preceding financial year

or an undertaking which generates twenty per cent of the total income of the Company during the previous financial year.

Management Discussions and Analysis Reports

This MD&A provides analysis of the operating performance of the company's business segments, as well as a discussion of cash flows, the impact of risks and outlook for the business, Additional information about the company.

Industry Overview

Infrastructure sector is a key driver for the Indian economy. The sector is highly responsible for propelling India's overall development and enjoys intense focus from Government for initiating policies that would ensure time-bound creation of world class infrastructure in the country. Infrastructure sector includes power, bridges, dams, roads and urban infrastructure development. In 2018, India ranked 44th out of 167 countries in World Bank's Logistics Performance Index (LPI) 2018.

Foreign Direct Investment (FDI) received in Construction Development sector (townships, housing, built up infrastructure and construction development projects) from April 2000 to March 2019 stood at US\$ 25.05 billion, according to the Department of Industrial Policy and Promotion (DIPP). The logistics sector in India is growing at a CAGR of 10.5 per cent annually and is expected to reach US\$ 215 billion in 2020.

India has a requirement of investment worth Rs 50 trillion (US\$ 777.73 billion) in infrastructure by 2022 to have sustainable development in the country. India is witnessing significant interest from international investors in the infrastructure space. Some key investments in the sector are listed below.

- In 2018, infrastructure sector in India witnessed private equity and venture capital investments worth US\$ 1.97 billion.
- In June 2018, the Asian Infrastructure Investment Bank (AIIB) has announced US\$ 200 million investment into the National Investment & Infrastructure Fund (NIIF).
- Indian infrastructure sector witnessed 91 M&A deals worth US\$ 5.4 billion in 2017

Overview of the Indian Economy

The Government of India is expected to invest highly in the infrastructure sector, mainly highways, renewable energy and urban transport.

The Government of India is taking every possible initiative to boost the infrastructure sector. Announcements in Union Budget 2019-20:

- The Government of India has given a massive push to the infrastructure sector by allocating Rs 4.56 lakh crore (US\$ 63.20 billion) for the sector.
- The Indian Railways received allocation under Union Budget 2019-20 at Rs 66.77 billion (US\$ 9.25 billion). Out of this allocation, Rs 64.587 billion (US\$ 8.95 billion) is capital expenditure.

- Rs 83,015.97 crore (US\$11.51 billion) allocated towards road transport and highway.
- Rs 3,899.9 crore (US\$ 540.53 billion) to increase capacity of Green Energy Corridor Project along with wind and solar power projects.
- Allocation of Rs 8,350.00 crore (US\$ 1.16 billion) to boost telecom infrastructure.
- Water supply to be provided to all households in 500 cities.
- Allocation of Rs 888.00 crore (US\$ 110.88 million) for the upgradation of state government medical colleges (PG seats) at the district hospitals and Rs 1,361.00 crore (US\$ 188.63 million) for government medical colleges (UG seats) and government health institutions.

Segment-wise Performance

The Company operates in one reportable segment i.e. Excavation and Piling. The Service Segments has been identified as separate segment in accordance with Accounting Standard 17 'Segment Reporting'.

Performance

During the year under review, the total income of the Company amounted to Rs. 8,95,53,026 as against Rs. 15,57,80,824 during the previous year. There is decrease in the turnover as compared to previous year and the Company has generated a net loss of Rs. 5,90,34,495 during the financial year 2019-20 as against the last year Profit after tax of Rs. 43,50,035. Your Directors are putting in their best efforts to improve the performance of the company even in the adverse scenario.

Risk Management

The Infrastructure sector is a key driver of the Indian economy. During 2019-20, there has been a significant push from the Government, which has been providing financial support and implementing initiatives to give a boost to the sector.

- The total national highways length increased to 122,434 kms in FY18 from 92,851 kms in FY14.

The Business risks as identified are reviewed and a detailed action plan to mitigate the identified risks is drawn up and its implementation is monitored.
